GLEESON YEAR 10 WORLD FOOTBALLERS COACH LOCAL YOUNGSTERS

The Gleeson Year 10 World Football Program Class visited Tea Tree Gully Primary School to run a series of coaching clinics for over 70 students ranging from Year 3-7 on the last day of Term 1.

We were invited to run the sessions as part of the TTG Primary School Sports Day and they proved a big hit with the excited young students.

Our Year 10 students ran the coaching clinics as part of their formal assessment, where they had to plan, design and implement a 'Skill Acquisition' session covering one of the four core skills in football; striking the ball, 1v1, running with the ball or first touch. It was great to see how our students adapted to the role of coach, which at times can be challenging, with many of them having to think quickly on their feet to make adjustments to their sessions so as to meet the ability levels of the younger students. It was pleasing to see our students grow in confidence and garner the necessary enthusiasm needed to coach and engage with primary school aged children. To their credit the sessions were very well organised, fun and met their objectives of helping to improve the footballing skills of their participants. Future potential could be seen in many of our coaches on the day, maybe the next Jose Mourinho or Ange Postecoglou is amongst them!

A big thank you to the students of Tea Tree Gully Primary School for their enthusiastic and engaging participation in the coaching sessions; it was clear to see they were enjoying themselves!

Thank you to Mr Chris Ryan, of Tea Tree Gully Primary School (and former student and pre-service teacher at Gleeson College) for helping to organise the day and allowing our students the opportunity to get their first taste of coaching, and also to Mr Dion Kirk, Gleeson World Football Program Coach, for his help in mentoring the students in their role as coaches on the day.

RAA STREET SMART SESSION MAKES IMPACT ON YEAR 11 STUDENTS



Late in Term 1, our Year 11 students travelled to the Adelaide Entertainment Centre to experience one of the most powerful and valuable elements of our Personal Development Program; the RAA Street Smart Driver Education Program.

Students spent four hours engaged with a variety of different presentations. They witnessed a re-enactment of a serious road accident to learn about the dangers on the road and their role as road users to reduce risks. Further to this, students heard from a variety of speakers, some of which were survivors of road accidents, while others had lost family members in preventable circumstances. The message conveyed throughout the day was very positive and one of hope, as it aimed to equip young people with the knowledge to consider risks while enhancing their safety on the road. GLEESON GIRLS SOAR HIGH @ INSPIRING WOMEN IN DEFENCE CHALLENGE



It was an absolute privilege for Miss Janelle Ruthven and myself to supervise nine amazing Gleeson students in action at the Inspiring Women in Defence Challenge held at Flinders University Campus on Thursday 13 April.

The day involved two challenges requiring an immense amount of problem solving and outside-the-box thinking against other like-minded students. In the first challenge, students needed to navigate through a war-ravaged landscape with their robot to rescue civilians and move obstacles. For most participants, this was the first opportunity they have encountered of programming. The second challenge involved students creating a cyber-attack. They had to look and plan entry points, escape routes and highlight weaknesses within the university and surrounding area.

Students then had an opportunity to talk to several inspiring women who work as engineers within the fields of Bio-Engineering, RADAR and Civil Engineering. The students heard of the challenges these women encountered to excel within their field and there was an overwhelming emphasis of leadership and collaboration within their colleagues.

Congratulations to one of our Gleeson teams, comprising of Tyler Dunlop (11 HSFEL), Rebecca Pratt (11 DSHEW) and Jessica Mills (11 FSMIL), pictured top and below, on their success in the Defence Challenge. This was a testament to the ability of these students to work as a team and problem solve under pressure. All our Gleeson teams are to be commended for how they represented the College at this event, and students involved should be immensely proud of the effort, determination and knowledge they displayed to achieve their very best.


When thinking about your future career, don't just think about your full-time career. The Army Reserve provides the opportunity for a part-time job where you will gain:

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
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
