Last week we held a full College Mass, once again celebrated by our much-loved College Chaplain, Monsignor John Swann. A highlight of the Mass was the fact that we were able to recognise Monsignor Swann's 60-year anniversary of his ordination as a Catholic Priest.



In addition to Monsignor's work in a number of parishes all over the state throughout the past six decades, he has been a member of numerous Catholic councils, committees and commissions, including the Diocesan Finance Council for 12 years. He also served as a Chaplain for the Army Reserve, and for more than 40 years has been closely involved with the Teams Movement. He has had a close association with the media, as a regular columnist for The Southern Cross, guest on the Catholic Hour radio show and producing Catholic television programs. Monsignor was awarded an OAM in 2013 for recognition of his incredible service to his faith. One of the other strongest influences in Monsignor Swann's life was Archbishop James Gleeson. As Monsignor himself said in a recent interview, "Archbishop

Gleeson paved the way for so many of those activities I became involved in. I used to work closely with him and over a number of years I would meet with him regularly. I was the first one ordained by him and that was the beginning of a special relationship."

We are so fortunate to continue that relationship with Monsignor as our College Chaplain, he is always willing to be here at Gleeson College to celebrate Mass and to continue to enrich our faith life. Congratulations on 60 wonderful years of service to your vocation Monsignor Swann.



GLEESON COLLEGE CAR PARK COURTESY

We kindly request families please read the following timely reminder regarding the safe flow of traffic in and around the Gleeson College car park. While there is a feeling of congestion when things go wrong, we have found that if all drivers follow the directions set out below, then traffic flows smoothly and the car park empties reasonably quickly.

Entry: Is always from the top entrance by the Gleeson College sign off Surrey Farm Drive. Please remember to travel along Surrey Farm Drive at no more than 25kmph when students are present and slow down to 10kmph once you have entered the College car park. Please do not park or stand, even briefly to drop students, in Surrey Farm Drive where this is clearly prohibited – along the stretch of road, both sides, opposite the car park area. Parking or standing are permissible further downhill along Surrey Farm Drive in front of the Gleeson ovals and well away from the bus zone areas.

Moving through and out of the car parking bays: All parking bays are one way, running away from the main administration building. If you have travelled along the bottom bay by the



oval and been unable to find a park, then you must not turn directly into the next bay entering and travelling in the reverse direction. This is when traffic jams are caused. Instead, the only option you can take is to proceed out of the car park onto Surrey Farm Drive and then re-enter from the top entrance.

Picking students up: As a general rule, students should wait along the oval near the seats adjacent to the shade ports to be picked up from the lower bay. Cars should move as far along the oval towards the exit before stopping to pick them up. Students waiting near the top lawns above the student car park can be picked up from the other bays where cars will pull into a vacant space and wait. Please take special care along the road that travels past the main administration building at all times of the day as there are four pedestrian crossings that drivers need to be aware of that are in operation throughout the day.

Please DO NOT: Park along the road that enters the car park and travels past the administration building to the oval. Always move to the most advanced space available to allow following cars to enter and to avoid a build-up of vehicles. Also, do not stop in the middle of a parking bay, which again causes blockages. At the busiest of times, cars may need to proceed out onto Surrey Farm Drive and move down below the bus zone to park and wait. Some parents also work out particular pick-up points outside of the car park to meet their children, even in streets beyond Surrey Farm Drive.

We thank you for your ongoing support to keep our students and staff safe in our College car park.

The preparation began with a warm up and a very strong, encouraging talk from Coach Taylor Krawczyk. Gleeson College took on Underdale High School in the Cross Group final of Open Boys Knockout Soccer held at the Adelaide Shores Complex last Tuesday. The winner of the match would qualify for the State Championship Final. After being knocked out against Underdale at this same stage last year the boys had extra incentive to put in a good showing.

The opening half was a tight and tense affair with both sides understandably keen to get the points, each team sharing good spells of possession and creating opportunities. Unfortunately, we were unable to capitalise on early chances and soon found ourselves down 0-2 despite playing the better football.
