Alex & Hanna's African Odyssey

Old Scholars Alex Turner (2005) and Hanna Nanson (2005) had a big year in 2006! The pair embarked on an expedition to Kibera, on the outskirts of Nairobi (the capital of Kenya), to work as volunteer teachers in a rural school.

After finding out about volunteer organisation, Cosmic Volunteers, on the internet, the tenacious pair contacted them immediately. They also raised \$1000 before they went abroad, to support a teacher at the school to further his teaching education.

Alex and Hanna taught English, Mathematics and Creative Arts to a group of up to 25 children, all aged between 9 and 12 years.

Below is an excerpt from an email the College was sent whilst they were on their trip:

"It's Hanna Nanson and Alex Turner over in Africa! So far, we have had an excellent time and seen many different things. As for our volunteering, we are working in Dorna Educational Centre in Kibera. Dorna is a private school which was set up four years ago to provide education for the children living in the slum areas. The children are aged 5 through to early teenage years and the subjects studied include: English, Maths, Social Studies, Science, Creative Arts, Religion, Kiswahili, and PE (Fridays). Alex and I teach mostly the older children who are 9 years old and above.

The school is very basic, with few of the necessities. We have brought some things over such as balls and colour pencils, for which they have been very grateful.

The kids are great. They are so enthusiastic and excited by our presence – they walk home with us everyday! Because Kibera is so poverty-stricken,

it is wonderful to see these kids getting an education against the odds. The feeling is unexplainable."

For now the pair are back in Adelaide, Hanna studying Accounting at the University of Adelaide, and Alex pursuing Network Engineering at TAFE. We congratulate Alex and Hanna for their outstanding efforts overseas.

his Year 12 scores at University College last year, which allowed him entry into the University course of his choice – Aerospace Engineering.




