# A FATHER'S ULTIMATE GIFT

Gleeson Old Scholar, Michael Ortuso (2001), has received the ultimate gift from his father Joe - his kidney.

Since a young age, Michael has been the sufferer of the rare, inherited disease, Alport Syndrome, which leads to a build-up of toxins in the kidneys and eventually to kidney failure.

Parents Joe and Lilian were told by doctors that Michael's condition was serious and he would need either dialysis for life, or a transplant once his own kidneys stopped working for him.

In 2006, Michael's health took a bad turn and tests revealed the toxins in his body were very high, indicating the onset of kidney failure. He would have just six months to find a kidney donor or submit to starting dialysis. Dad Joe immediately put his hand up to see if he was a possible donor match, and after tireless testing, the family was overjoyed to discover he was!

The operation went ahead and was a great success. Michael felt 100% better straight away and Joe came through the life-saving operation with flying colours!

We would like to thank Joe, Lilian, Michael and little sister Deanna (2006) for sharing this touching story with our community and send them our best wishes for a happy and healthy future.

# Running a Gift for Talented Dale

Old Scholar Dale Woodhams (05) has beaten race favourite Damian Tohl and Queenslander Brad Peters to take out the 120m Mt Gambier Gift late last year. After winning the 70m Open event earlier in the day, Dale sped home to grab the \$5000 winner's cheque, and also pushed himself into the limelight leading up to the 2007 Bay Sheffield. Dale wore a black arm-band during his race in memory of close friend Rachel Kasperski (03), who tragically died a week prior to the event. He also paid a special tribute to her in his victory speech.

Dale had a very successful season last year, including winning the City of West Torrens 120m Open Gift, a close second place in the Hallett Cove 100m Open Mayor's Gift and sensational performances in the 100m and 200m events at the 2007 Australian Under 20 & 23 Championships.

The 2008 Australian Under 20 & 23 Championships were held two weeks ago at Griffith University on the Gold Coast (QLD). Dale ran a time of 11.05sec in his Under 23 100m Sprint heat, his time just short of grabbing him a final berth. However, he ran superbly in the

200m heats to secure a place in the final, and went on to place fourth with a brilliant time of 21.87s.
