KASEY A TOP GUN IN HIS FIELD!

Lieutenant Kasey Puyenbroek (*Class of 1994*) was recently presented with the Chief of Navy ceremonial sword by Vice Admiral Russ Shalders, AO, CSC, RAN, Chief of the Navy (CN).

Kasey won the special award for his outstanding performance during his Graduate Engineer Officer application course in 2006.

The presentation, which was made on 6th June, was part of a parade to farewell the outgoing CN by the officers and sailors at HMAS Stirling in Western Australia.

Kasey was also recently posted as a Combat Systems Engineer with the Navy Warfare Systems Agency in Sydney. He will be working on the adaptation and integration of the Aegis Combat System from the base American design to the Australian specifications required for the Royal Australian Navy's new Air Warfare Destroyer, which will be built by ASC at Osborne in Adelaide. The band's second album, When the Flood Comes, was released in April this year and is already attracting




rave reviews, debuting in the Top 20 on the ARIA Chart.
