THE SACRED HEART + SCHOOL WIDE PEDAGOGY



The Sacred Heart and School Wide Pedagogy - What is the link?

Today is the feast of the Sacred Heart celebrated on Friday 19 days after Pentecost.

Your heart pumps about 100,000 times a day to keep your lifeblood flowing through you. For this reason it has become a symbol for our very selves. We say, "I put my heart into it" and "I want that with all my heart." The heart also is a symbol for love, perhaps because it seems to beat faster when we are in love. The biblical image of the heart means the depth of our selves where we decide for or against God. God, who always speaks to us using our own experiences, has chosen our symbol of the heart to represent Jesus. The heart of Jesus was a human heart like ours. It stopped beating the day Jesus was crucified. According to the Gospel of John, after Jesus had died a soldier made sure of his death by piercing his side with a lance. Blood and water ran out (19:34). Jesus' pierced heart became a sign of the completeness of his love for us, a love that compelled him to die for us and that prompted him to remain with us in the bread and wine of the Eucharist. We acknowledge and promote collaboration and whole-hearted engagement in authentic learning. We look forward with hope and joy to the contribution our graduating students will make to the world."

As you can see, the ethos of the heart is strong at Gleeson College and you will be hearing more about the school wide pedagogy as the year progresses.





