

GLEESON JAPAN TRIP 2019 > A Rich Immersion in Japanese Culture

Monday of Week 7 last term saw the early morning departure of 12 Gleeson College students from Adelaide Airport as they embarked on a 17-day whirlwind cultural immersion trip through Japan. Supported by two staff members, the students experienced only a brief snippet of what Japan has to offer, but certainly put their years of learning Japanese to good use!

The group experienced the hustle and bustle of downtown Osaka, the peaceful calm of traditional temples and shrines in Kyoto and the inquisitive deer of Nara. Students also took a moment to reflect at the Atomic Bomb Peace Park and Memorials in Hiroshima, visited the ancient Himeji Castle, and explored the many suburbs of the sprawling metropolis that is Tokyo.

As part of the trip, students were involved in the day-to-day planning of activities, as well as navigating their way through the Tokyo subway and rail network. Students enjoyed immersing themselves in the varied experiences Japan has to offer - from traditional life such as staying in a ryokan, through to cutting-edge technologies such as Teamlab Borderless Digital Art Museum in Tokyo Bay.

We visited many different restaurants, showcasing the wide variety of food options that were readily available, and providing students the opportunity to try many new and unusual foods. Trips to the local konbini (convenience store) and various vending machines were frequent given the hot, humid weather, and always entertaining and novel.

An especially memorable part of the trip, as has been the case for each Japan Trip, was the opportunity to homestay with students from our sister school, Kogakuin, which is located about 30



minutes west of Tokyo. Over four nights and five days they experienced what growing up and studying in Japan is like, complete with going to school on a Saturday! On their non-school days, students were spoilt with a huge range of outings from their host families: grape picking, visiting Mt Fuji, going to a ninja restaurant, zoos, and much, much more. Needless to say there were some teary goodbyes at the end of the homestay.

After 17 days it was time to say sayonara to Japan and fly home, leaving the land of the rising sun, and its incredibly kind, generous and welcoming people.

This trip would not have been possible without the support of the Gleeson Community, the students' parents,

and teaching staff: arigato gozaimasu. Thank you also to the staff, students and host families of Kogakuin too, for without their wonderful hospitality, our students could not experience what life in Japan is truly like. While this trip presented a variety of new experiences, and with it small challenges along the way, each of the students participated whole-heartedly and by the end of the trip, had made many memories and friendships that will last a lifetime.

SUN SMART AT GLEESON COLLEGE

Gleeson College has a duty of care to staff and students at all times. This duty of care includes protection against weather conditions during times when students would normally be outside.

Skin damage, including skin cancer, is the result of cumulative exposure to the sun. Much of the damage occurs during childhood and adolescence. Research suggests that severe sunburn is a contributor to skin cancer and other forms of skin damage such as wrinkles, sunspots, blemishes and premature ageing.

Gleeson College can help to reduce the incidence of skin damage and skin cancer by encouraging all members of the College community to take effective skin protection measures.

The College encourages all students to apply sunscreen and we will provide sunscreen for planned outdoor activities and it is available from Student Services during the day. **It is also important for students to also wear the College hat when choosing to play outdoors at break times. If students are not wearing the College hat, they will be asked to move to a shaded area.**

Earlier this year our Year 8 students completed a unit of inquiry in Science on the Moon to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Apollo 11 mission to the moon. Students completed two investigation tasks linked to this - a Science writing piece and a choice investigation. The top two pieces of student work for both tasks from each class were entered into the 2019 Oliphant Science Awards and judged in the state-wide competition.



The Oliphant Science Awards is an annually held competition for South Australian school students from Reception to Year 12 to develop their interest in Science through a Science-based competition, with a range of categories to suit a wide variety of abilities and interests. The Oliphant Science Awards provide students an opportunity to expand their scientific literacy, by showing interest and understanding in the world around them and engaging in discussions about Science.

On Friday 20 September, this year's State Prize Winners were invited to the Winner's Ceremony where their final placings were announced. It gives me great pleasure to announce that Gleeson College had the work of three students recognised in 2019.



GC STUDENTS EXCEL IN AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL CHEMISTRY QUIZ

The Australian National Chemistry Quiz (ANCO) is the Premium Chemical Education activity run by the Royal Australian Chemical Institute. The Quiz has been in operation since 1982, growing from humble beginnings into an international event spread over 23 countries, 7 languages, 1400 schools and over 94,000 students. The quiz is not an exam but a means of promoting Chemistry in schools and enthusing the students to study Chemistry. Due to the wide and varied participation base, the quiz is not based on a specific syllabus, but rather the questions have been designed on a process basis, so that students should be able to deduce the answer from the material supplied.



In 2019, Gleeson College had a group of 32 Year 7-9 students participate, and six of these students received Certificates of Merit. Ava Cannard (8 MMMIT) and Lachlan Cannard (8 MMMIT) are congratulated on their Certificates of Distinction, resulting from placing in the top 10-25% of the state. Izabella Kozak (8 MMMIT), Finn McFadden (8 HMDIT), Kirrilee Molloy (8 MMMIT) and Grace Souter (8 MMMIT) are also congratulated for their Certificates of Credit, which are awarded to the top 25-40% achieving students in the state.

ONE+ ENGLISH EXCURSION > Creative Writing Workshop + State Library Tour

In the last week of Term 3, a group of Year 11 students from both Gleeson



College and Pedare Christian College nominated to attend the inaugural One+ English excursion, featuring a Creative Writing Workshop and a tour of the State Library of South Australia.

The Creative Writing Workshop was held in the Braggs Lecture Theatre at the University of Adelaide. Gleeson and Pedare students joined over 300 senior students from a range of schools across Adelaide for this event, where they participated in a number of creative writing activities facilitated by Dr Rosslyn Prosser, Dr Matthew Hooton and various PhD candidates. The first session focused on a discussion of the four facets of creative writing: Meaning, Magic, Memory and Money.

The students were then offered the opportunity to create and share a six-word story, entering the best of these into a competition. The workshop also covered the importance of word choice, setting, sentence length and structure in creating a sense of atmosphere in a text. After the break, students were able to ask questions of the panel of presenters about creative writing, the Arts courses at the university and



various career options. Congratulations are in order for Gleeson College student, Taliesha O'Shea (11 FSHOL), whose six-word story was one of just five selected as overall winners. Her winning story - "Hairdresser did me dirty - no hair." Taliesha chose a book from a selection of local authors as her prize!

The workshop was an excellent opportunity for secondary students to learn more about the craft of English, as well as experiencing education in a tertiary setting, from knowledgeable university staff. They were able to listen to students from many different

schools share their work in a supportive environment.

After a lunch break at the Myer Centre Food Court, the students then walked to the State Library of South Australia, where library staff conducted a behind-the-scenes tour of the library facilities, including the archives in the basement, and the famous Mortlock Wing. Students learned how to use the library resources, as well as the role of the library as caretaker of millions of documents, recorded interviews, maps, books, toys, photographs and letters.

Students and staff were surprised to find in the archives a selection of Gleeson College and Pedare Yearbooks, dating back to 1989. The tour was highly informative and was a great introduction to the library as an incredibly useful resource to students in the future.

Thank you to all the students who attended, as well as English Teachers' Miss Amy Curtis (Gleeson) and Mr James Goodall (Pedare), who assisted in escorting our group on the day.

All those who attended engaged keenly in the opportunity to learn more about the writing process, and educational options beyond Year 12. One+ hopes to make this opportunity an annual event for the benefit of all Year 11 students on the campus in 2020.
