

'GLEESON'S GREAT EXHIBITION' > Year 9 HaSS Student Showcase



GLEESON PERFORMING ARTS ON SHOW @ SFX MAD MARCH FAIR






JACK + SA ROBOTICS TEAM OFF TO DETROIT FOR WORLD STEM COMP.




Congratulations to Year 10 student Jack Hutchins (10 FSWES) and his South Australian team 'Roboroos' on a super effort at the FIRST® Robotics Competition held in Sydney recently.

The First Robotics Competition was run over a six-week build period, constructing a robot from scratch, which once finished weighed 50kg! Jack and his teammates spent two weeks designing the robot with Computer Aided Drawing (CAD) software, before the physical build, which took a further four weeks. Helping the team were their adult mentors including industry engineers, school teachers, university lecturers, university students, FIRST® alumni and many others. These mentors use their experience to teach, guide and shape the students through the FIRST® Robotics Competition program. The competition phase was held over three days at Sydney Olympic Park and Roboroos finished an admirable 47th out of 63 teams nationwide (see photos). A great effort!



Jack and an SA team of 10 members now look forward to travelling abroad to the United States to contest the FIRST® Lego League Competition to be held in Detroit from 24-27 April. This will be one of the world's largest celebration of STEM for students, and offers the chance for our Aussie teams to compete against teams from the US, Europe and Asia! We wish Jack and the SA team all the best for a successful competition.

WHY BOTHER LEARNING A SECOND LANGUAGE?

This is a question language teachers often get asked. If a student doesn't intend to work or live overseas, then what is the point?

It might surprise you to learn, though, that statistics show Australians speak more than 350 languages at home and at work, and that 1 in 4 Australians were born overseas. So I'd bet a large amount of yen that you meet someone who speaks a language other than English every day. It is therefore crucial we develop our students' ability to interact and communicate with people from other cultures, so they can do so respect and dignity.

With national high school enrolments for second languages dropping from 40% in the 1960s to just 11%, we language teachers face an uphill battle. Research into language studies at high school has found that students' two greatest barriers to learning a second language are 1) restricted subject selection and access, and 2) perceived difficulty.

Yes, learning a foreign language can be challenging as it takes time and patience – something we are losing appreciation for in a world where we expect instant answers thanks to rapid technological advances.

These same advances, however, provide almost limitless tools to aid language learning. By installing an app or two, students can download flashcards on their phone, take virtual tours to a Japanese or Italian town,

practice verb conjugation on the bus, and find out anything they wish to know about the world with just a few keystrokes. I sure wish I had access to all that when I started learning Japanese!

Furthermore, the benefits of learning a second language while you're young far outweigh the negatives - did you know it actually makes your brain grow? We've known for some time that foreign language skills can potentially increase job prospects and increase one's ability to interact in an increasingly globalised world, however these recent studies show it actually makes you smarter: your brain grows as your memory, perception and reasoning skills strengthen. These heightened skills then transfer across to students' other subjects, because to form sentences in Japanese or Italian for example, you need to know what an adjective is, or what a verb is.

While learning a language you also develop writing/listening/ reading/ speaking skills simultaneously, so your multi-tasking ability increases. And finally, second language learning

teaches us to take small risks, make mistakes, and learn from them - life skills every student needs the opportunity to develop so they can grow their confidence.

To successfully operate in Australia in the 21st Century it is vital our students learn skills to be able to interact with people from other cultures. Learning a second (or third!) language teaches us more than just vocab or alphabets, it teaches us tolerance, understanding, intercultural communication, and respect for others; it teaches us how to live and work harmoniously in our multicultural society.

Sure, different alphabets and having to worry about gender agreement can be tricky to master, but with just 5-10 minutes of practise a day you can be *pera-pera* (fluent) in no time.

So, why bother learning a second language? To build a stronger brain, increase job prospects, and develop vital life skills!



YEAR 10 OUTDOOR ED > Rock Climbing @ Morialta




We came, we saw, we conquered!

YEAR 12 VISUAL ARTS - ART + DESIGN > SACE Art Show + School of Art Tour





Stage 2 Visual Arts students attended an excursion to see the Year 12 SACE Art Show 2019 held at the Adelaide College of Arts last week.


