On Wednesday, Hughes House gathered for their inaugural celebration of the Eucharist, highlighting the key theme of ‘The Lamp of the Body’, which informs their House Motto of *‘With Justice We Serve’*.

Father Manu Kumbidiyamackal from our local parish of Para Hills Modbury presided over Mass and shared with us a series of vital truths about how we can serve each other and our families with justice.

It was a unique celebration for the Gleeson community as it was the first celebration of the Eucharist for the school year due to Covid restrictions. We united as Hughes House with the belief we can make a difference in our world, we have a clear purpose in what we do and that we bring a positive attitude and compassionate approach, which allows us to respond to these challenges well. So, making a difference begins within ourselves. To achieve this, we must use the talents and gifts we have been given to work for change and to serve for justice.



A reading from St Paul’s first letter to the Corinthians [1 Corinthians 12: 1-11]

There are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit is the source of them all. There are different kinds of service, but we serve the same Lord. God works in different ways, but it is the same God who does the work in all of us. A spiritual gift is given to each of us, so we can help each other. To one person the Spirit gives the ability to give wise advice; to another the same Spirit gives a message of special knowledge. The same Spirit gives great faith to another, and to someone else the one Spirit gives the gift of healing. He gives

one person the power to perform miracles, and another the ability to prophesy. He gives someone else the ability to discern whether a message is from the Spirit of God or from another spirit. Still another person is given the ability to speak in unknown languages, while another is given the ability to interpret what is being said. It is the one and only Spirit who distributes all these gifts. He alone decides which gift each person should have.

I am sure you can think of many other examples which point to the importance of keeping our planet healthy and clean. As Christians we have a responsibility to



YEAR 7 ENGLISH > Tuning in to National Simultaneous Storytime!




Ms DeConno's Year 7 English students tuned in to 2022 National Simultaneous Storytime in class on Wednesday, along with over 2.1 million other young Australians!

YEAR 11 FAITH + LIVING GRATITUDE TREE GROWS!



Having had the privilege of working with young people for many years, I am increasingly amazed and inspired by them. An activity this week in our Year 11 Faith & Living class reminded me again how much fun and how open young people are when they are invited into connection with us “more experienced” (i.e. older!) humans.

We have had some great success already this year with the introduction of The Resilience Project led by Mr Adam Lewis (Assistant Principal Student Development) and a key element of the GEM focus is GRATITUDE (GEM – gratitude, empathy, mindfulness). In our Faith & Living class this week we created a Gratitude Tree – the idea being that we reflect on our states of emotion and think about the strategies we use to either move out of negative emotions or hold on to and enjoy the positive ones. The “tree” is where the emojis and strategies are attached to a “leaf” and then added to the tree, symbolic of our interconnectedness and that understanding emotions is actually very important for a healthy, functional life.

When I first introduced the idea there was some resistance! We are certainly not used to such mindfulness, especially in our increasingly fast-paced world. Playing some mindful, contemporary music to set the tone I did wonder where the lesson might go..... imagine my delight when every student involved themselves and each was actually fully present in the activity (it was mindfulness in action!). It was just wonderful. Well done Year 11s.




STAGE 1 + 2 NUTRITION > 'Flavour Chemistry' with Adel. Uni




